For *Royal Question Royal Master* the student will answer all 29 questions.

Q1. What is the gospel?	The good news of the kingdom, revealed in Jesus. (Matthew 9:35)
Q2. What is the work of God the Father in the gospel?	The Father gave his only Son for our salvation. (John 3:16)
Q3. Why would the Father choose to save sinners like us?	Because he is "merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." (Exodus 34:6)
Q4. How did the Son come into the world?	He was conceived by the Spirit and born of a virgin. (Luke 1:34-35)
Q5. Did Jesus stop being God when he became a man?	No. He was fully God and fully man (John 1:1,14).
Q6. Did Jesus ever sin?	No. He lived a sinless life (Hebrews 4:15).
Q7. What is the work of God the Son in the gospel?	Jesus lived, died, and rose again to bring us into the kingdom. (1 Cor. 15:3-4, Col. 1:13-14)
Q8. Why did Jesus live?	That his righteous life might be counted to us. (Romans 5:19)
Q9. Why did Jesus die?	To bear the punishment for our sins. (Gal. 3:13, 1 John 4:10)
Q10. Why did Jesus rise from the dead?	That we might have new life in him. (2 Cor. 5:17)
Q11. What is the work of God the Holy Spirit in the gospel?	To unite us to Jesus. (1 John 5:11, Col 3:3)
Q12. How does the Holy Spirit unite us to Jesus?	He gives us a new heart and the gift of faith. (Ezek. 36:26-27, John 6:63)
Q13. What does a new heart and the gift of faith enable us to do?	To turn from our sins and trust in Jesus. (Mark 1:15, Acts 16:14)
Q14. What do we confess as we turn from our sins and trust Jesus?	Jesus is Lord. (Romans 10:9)
Q15. What does it mean that Jesus is Lord?	He is King over all. (Psalm 110:1, Revelation 19:11)
Q16. What does it mean for Jesus to be your Lord?	That I no longer live for my glory but for his. (Psalm 110:3, 2 Peter 3:18)
Q17. What is the blessing of being united with Jesus in life?	I am adopted as a child of God. (Galatians 4:4-5)
Q18. What is the blessing of being united to Jesus when you die?	My spirit is received by God into heaven. (1 Thess. 5:9-10)
Q19. What is the blessing of being united to Jesus at the end of the age?	My body will be raised for eternal life in the kingdom. (2 Corinthians 4:14, 1 Corinthians 6:14)
Q20. Do you deserve these blessings?	No. They come by grace alone. (Ephesians 2:8-9)
Q21. What is grace?	Grace is God loving me in Jesus, even though I don't deserve it. (Ephesians 2:4-5)
Q22. Do all people receive God's grace?	No. Many people die in their sins. (Matthew 7:13)
Q23. What happens to people who die in their sins?	They are punished forever in hell. (2 Thess. 1:9)
Q24. What does the punishment of hell teach us?	That God is just and our sin is awful. (Rev 16:7)
Q25. How does God feel about sending people to hell?	"God takes no pleasure in the death of the wicked." (Ezek. 33:11)
Q26. Who can be saved from sin and death and hell?	"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." (Romans 10:13)
Q27. When is the end of the age?	When Jesus comes again. (Rev 1:7)
Q28. Why are we eager for Jesus to come again?	Evil will be defeated, the kingdom completed, and God will be all in all. (1 Cor 15:24-28)
Q29. What does the promise of Jesus' return lead us to pray?	"Come, Lord Jesus" (Rev 22:20)
