What is a virtue?

A virtue is a quality considered morally good or desirable.

What is a vice?

A vice is a quality considered morally bad or undesirable.

1	What is Adaptation?	The change or process of change by which a person becomes better suited to a situation or environment.
2	What is Bravery?	The quality or state of having or showing mental or moral strength to face danger, fear, or difficulty.
3	What is Calmness?	A state of tranquility or peace; typically, free from agitation, excitement, or anxiety.
4	What is Compassion?	Sympathetic awareness of the distress of others coupled with a desire to alleviate the pain or discomfort being caused.
5	What is Contentment?	The quality of being satisfied with current state of life events, circumstances, and interpersonal relationships.
6	What is Cooperation?	The process of working together to achieve the same goal or accomplish a common task.
7	What is Courage?	The ability to do something that is frightening or the strength to persevere in the face of grief, pain, or danger.
8	What is Curiosity?	The inquisitive interest in the affairs of others or the operational details and functionality involved in the affairs of the universe.

9	What is Dedication?	A strong desire to do or to achieve something, typically requiring determination and hard work.
10	What is Dependability?	Capable of being relied on for consistency in character or trusted for in accomplishment of a task.
11	What is Dignity?	Formal reservation of seriousness of manner, appearance, or language reflecting worth or quality of being.
12	What is Diligence?	Careful and persistent work or effort.
13	What is Empathy?	The ability to place yourself in position of another person.
14	What is Endurance?	The ability to withstand hardship or adversity that is unusually prolonged and stressful.
15	What is Faithfulness?	Steadfast in affection or allegiance.
16	What is Friendliness?	Favorably disposed; inclined to approve, help, or support.
17	What is Forgiveness?	To stop being angry with someone who has done something wrong.
18	What is Foresight?	The ability to correctly judge what is going to happen.
19	What is Fortitude?	Bravery when dealing with pain or difficulty over a long period of time.
20	What is Generosity?	A willingness to give help or support, especially more than is usual or expected.
